

Handspun Crochet Cowl

The example was made using 2 different balls of hand spun yarn, approximately 250 yards each, one dyed Merino and one natural colored Corriedale.

It was spun on my Kromski Sonata.

Held together they make a bulky weight yarn.

Choose a hook that will give you a nice loose, but not flimsy fabric. I used an 8 mm.

SET UP ROW::

Chain 34

Sc in the 2nd chain from the hook. *Ch 3.
Skip 3 chains.
Sc in the 4th chain*
Repeat * to* to the end.

Chain 2 and turn



For the rest of the cowl, repeat the following two rows until it fits nicely around your neck.

ROW 1:

Ch 3.

*Work 3 dc in the space created by the ch 3 in the previous row.

Ch 1.*

Repeat to the end.

ROW 2:

*Ch 3

Sc in the hole created by the chain one in the previous row.* Repeat to the end.

Ch 1 and turn.

Finish with a Row 2. Weave in the ends.



Add buttons as shown in the photo. There are no actual button holes, so you'll want to test the buttons to be sure that they are a good size. They should fit comfortably through the open fabric, and still be snug enough to hold it in place.
